

Bergeggi looks like a hanging garden, watching over the arc shaped Ligurian coast and the homonymous islet, it features a natural heritage preserved by the Regional Natural Reserve and by the Marine Protected Area. The limestone cliffs interspersed with the green

miss the guided tours (Cave "Gallery of the train", Marine Cave, snorkeling, diving and kayaking) and, to live Bergeggi independently: apnea, s.u.p. and scenic walking (the Botanic Path, the ancient Roman road, the cork oak woodland, the fortifications).

The park is located in the easternmost part of Liguria and includes the river areas of Magra and Vara and the Promontory of Caprione, whose steep cliffs plunge into the crystal clear sea. The Magra River hosts unique wetlands, with staging and nesting areas for migratory birds. The Vara River rapids run mostly through narrow valleys. Mount Caprione hosts the Botanical Garden of Montemarcello and is characterized by a rich biodiversity and surprising historic and landscaped features. Be sure not to miss the many walking paths, kayak trips along the Magra and Vara Rivers or at sea, horseback riding, biking on dedicated paths along the river, snorkeling at the beaches of Caprione and "streamed hiking" by walking on the river beds.
